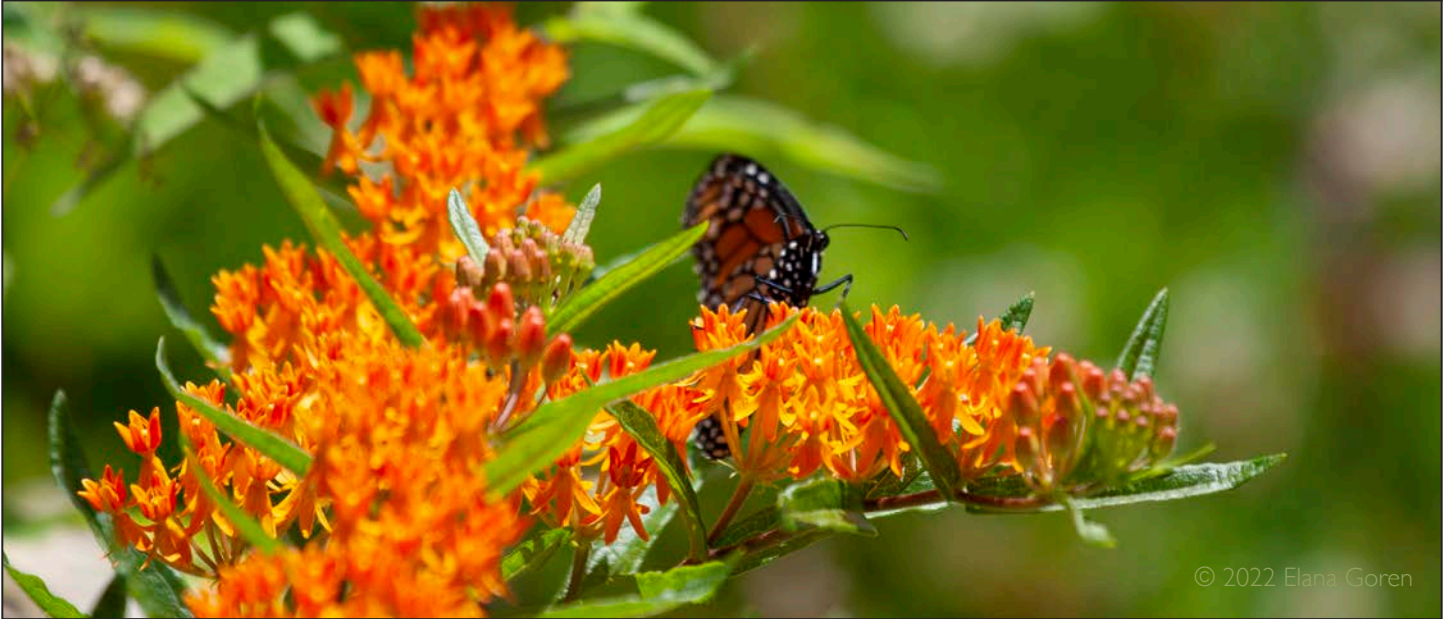
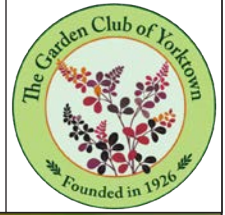


Butterfly Milkweed

Garden Use Native and pollinator garden, butterfly garden, border, roadside, rock garden, meadow, mass-planting

Benefits NY native plant that attracts pollinators like butterflies and bees. It is a host plant for butterfly species, especially the Monarch butterfly. It is also deer and rabbit resistant.

This bright, colorful, low-maintenance, native perennial is very easy to grow and is crucial to helping Monarch butterfly populations. It tolerates clay and dry soils and is salt resistant.
