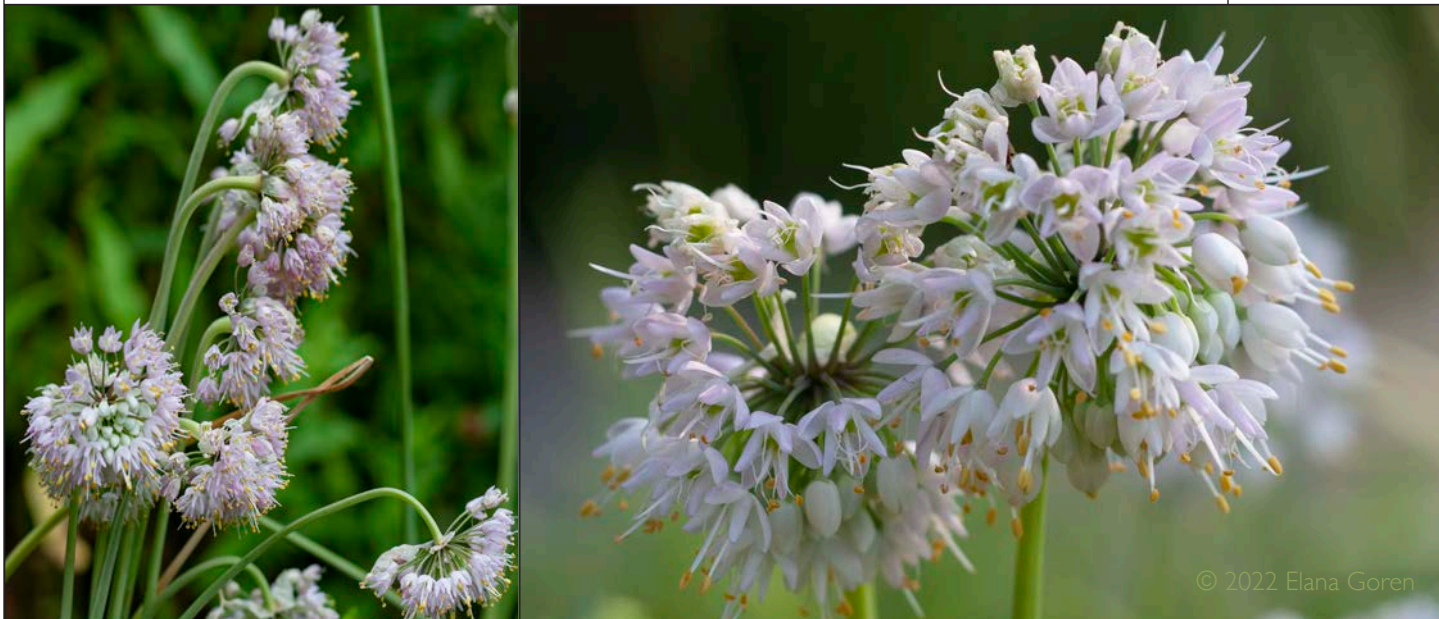


Nodding Onion

- Light** Full sun to partial shade
- Water** Drought-tolerant once established
- Soil** Adaptable, naturally found in rocky soil
- Hardiness Zones** 4 – 8
- Height** 1 to 3 feet when flowering, leaves are up to 1 foot
- Spacing** 12 inches
- Bloom Times** June – August
- Bloom Color** Deep pink to white
- Garden Use** Cottage garden, native and pollinator garden, rock garden, butterfly garden, meadow, mass-planting
- Benefits** NY native plant that attracts pollinators such as hummingbirds, butterflies and bees and is deer resistant.
- Bright green tufts of leaves emerge in early spring. Arching stems grow by early summer with buds opening to an array of pinks and whites through to late summer.
- Nodding Onion is also an edible herb.
