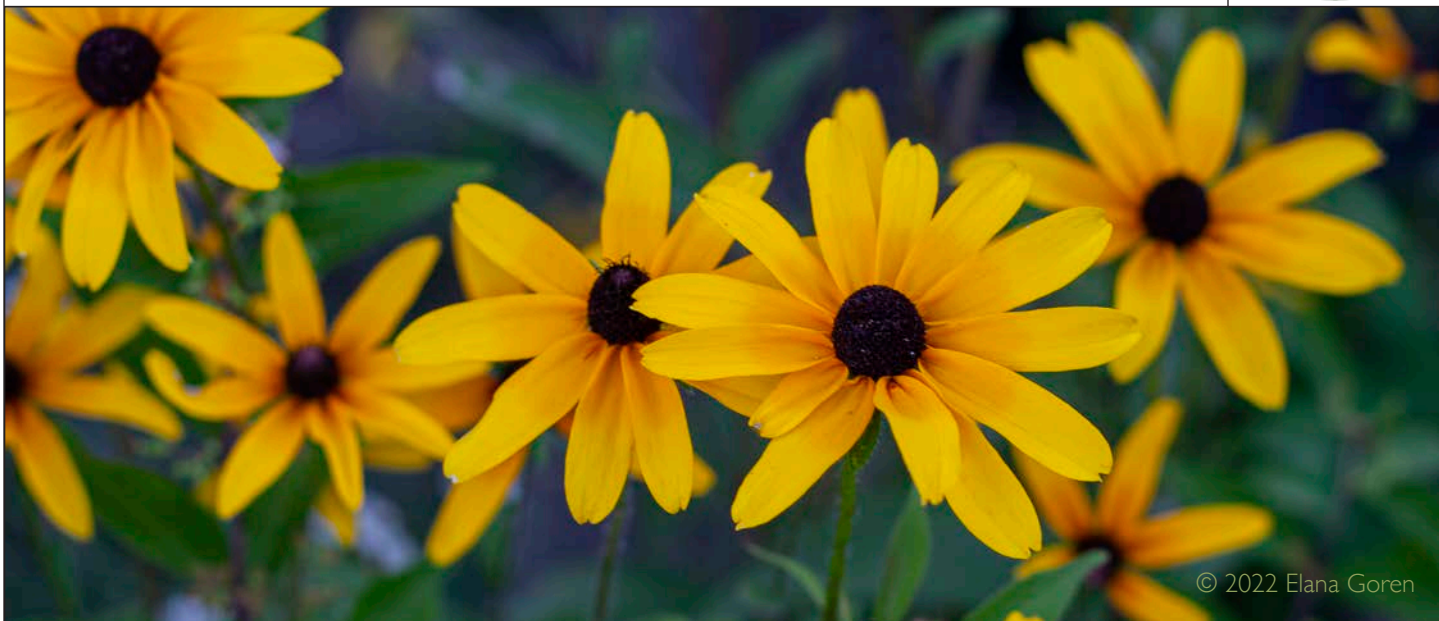


Black-Eyed Susan

- Light Full sun to partial shade
- Water Drought-tolerant
- Soil Adaptable to all but wet soils
- Hardiness Zones 3 – 7
- Height 2 – 3 feet
- Spacing 18 – 24 inches
- Bloom Times June – September
- Bloom Color Yellow
- Garden Use Native and pollinator garden, butterfly garden, roadside garden, meadow, mass-planting
- Benefits NY native plant that attracts pollinators like butterflies and bees and is a host plant for a number of butterfly species. It is also deer resistant.

This low-maintenance, short-lived, native perennial reseeds readily and is very easy to grow. It tolerates clay and dry soils and is salt resistant.
